- Convenient telephone sessions Coaching takes place over the phone, so your employees can easily schedule calls around their work hours.
- Skilled experts Participating health education professionals have received specialized training in lifestyle and behavior-change counseling.
- Customized action plans Coaches work with your employees to create achievable steps that fit their lifestyles.
- Medical record integration With access to member electronic medical records, coaches can support employees by identifying missed appointments, making medication reminders, and reinforcing physician recommendations.

#### **Coaching works**

73% of participants who had two or more sessions said coaching helped them achieve their weight goals. And 71% would recommend it.\*
